Our Book Fair last week was a roaring success. Thank you to all of you were able to support this and to Mrs Coates for running this again.



We plan to hold a 'Champion of Champions' competition next half term so that we can crown a King/ Queen of Tables so keep practising when you earn those badges. Knowing times tables by heart are such a vital skill that enables learners to make accelerated progress in their maths work. Instead of trying to calculate these facts, they can spend their time moving onto more advanced problem solving.
