Re: Partial Reopening of Schools

I am writing to you to outline our procedures for the partial re-opening of school to all learners in Years R (Reception), 1 and 6. As I am sure you can imagine, there is a wealth of information to share and I am conscious that whilst I don't want to overload you, I am sure you will have many questions about this provision and how we will be working to keep our community safe. Drop Off & Collection Times

These have been staggered to avoid large groups needing to travel to or arrive at school at the same time. Only one adult should attend with each child. All of the main gates into the playground will be open to pedestrians. There will be no Breakfast Club.

Each family will be asked to stand next to coloured cones which are spaced 2m apart. Please ensure that you arrive promptly at the times detailed below and stand by the relevant coloured cones:

If you arrive late without agreeing this with us, your child will be unable to attend school on that day. We are sorry to be this uncompromising but for the safety of our staff, we need to avoid the possible spread of infection through the foyer area with children from multiple families entering through the main reception area. We would also like parents/carers, where possible, to continue to communicate with us by email or telephone if you possible can. If you do need to visit and speak to us in person, only one family is allowed into the foyer area at a time.

If you are disabled and need to use our car park, please contact us so that we can arrange a drop off time that differs from those stated in this letter and we will collect your child from the car park.

School Dinners

Our kitchens will re-open on the 2nd June as well. For children in EYFS/KS1 and those in receipt of free school meals, this will continue to be provided free of charge. Other parents/carers of Y6 children will need to pay for these via SQuid as normal. Hot meals will be 'bag meals' and will be eaten in classrooms. A menu will be sent out on 1st June.

Snacks

In EYFS, snacks will be provided. In years 1 and 6, children may continue to bring in their own mid morning snacks or may choose a piece of fruit to wash and eat. Unfortunately we cannot provide cheese toasties at the moment.

School Curriculum


Clearly our curriculum will change slightly to accommodate this new way of working in smaller class groups and adjusted timings. We will continue to focus on the key skills of reading, writing and maths at an age appropriate level. We have also planned some sports/outdoor learning activities. These will take place separately in each group with structured time outside provided each day. This will differ from our traditional playtime but will give children the chance to be outside whilst still socially distancing as much as possible.

Y6 will be working on some activities and tasks aimed at ensuring they are 'high school ready,' and raring to go when they start their new schools in September.

I appreciate there is lots of discussion in the news about schools returning at the moment and many of you may have concerns about your child returning.
