



Dear Parents/Carers,

As you know we recognised Anti-Bullying Week this week. Our learners from Year 1 up watched a BBC Live Lesson all about this year's theme, "Choose Respect." If you haven't had a chance to view the [video](#) linked to this campaign, it is well worth it as a talking point with your child.

I know it feels incredibly early (it still is!) to talk about Christmas but it is quickly marching towards us. Each year we put on a whole school performance which every learner from Y1 to 6 takes part in. As our performances are VERY busy, we hold a separate Christmas Song performance for EYFS. To adhere to fire regulations, we initially restrict tickets for these events to 2 per family. However, there are often additional tickets which are not taken so we are able to allocate these to other family members. We have never had to turn anyone away yet. A letter will come home in the next couple of weeks telling you how to book your tickets.

Finally, thank you to all of the parents who make sure our learners arrive on school on time every day. It is so important for our learners to be in school with their peers at the start of the day. Entering once everyone else is settled can be really daunting and often causes upset. From Monday, I have asked office staff to record lateness and reasons for this so that, if this is a recurring issue, we can look at ways to support you and your child to arrive for the start of the school day.

PE KITS - ADVANCE WARNING (JANUARY START)

Some of you will remember that during Covid restrictions, children attended school in their PE kits on PE days. Some schools continued with this but we eventually reverted back to keeping kits in school. However, we plan to start asking our learners Y1 to Y6 only to attend in PE kits again on their PE days **from January**. EYFS will continue to keep these in school as they use changing sessions as a way of working on their physical development.

We have made this decision because we feel that so much sports/active time is wasted getting changed and we want our learners to develop active and healthy lifestyles. Alongside this, an increasing number of our learners tell us that they feel uncomfortable changing in class. So we have listened to our learners. Our PE Kit uniform is below. We will not insist that trainers are black as we appreciate that it is expensive to buy multiple pairs but our normal school uniform (including black shoes) should be worn on other days.

- Plain white T-shirt with or without school logo
- Plain navy blue shorts/skorts (worn under joggers if cold)
- Warm outer clothing such as sweatshirt and jogging bottoms ([navy, black or dark grey](#))
- Training shoes/Plimsolls
