We are a reading school! We know how

supports good mental health and wellbeing.

Learners from Nursery to Y6 are encouraged  
to read, 20 age appropriate books (this can be  
with an adult, particularly for younger learners  
or those with SEND) to earn their reading  
badge. Reading Scheme books do not count  
but any of the other books in our book  
bundles, including in KS2, the class reader  
do. There is a different colour to earn each  
year.
